

### Hundreds Visit City Hospitals on National Day

### Hotel Dieu Class Is Graduated With Exercises at St. Joseph's

Hundreds of visitors yesterday inspected the various New Orleans hospitals, which had announced that they would welcome callers in honor of the birthday of Florence Nightingale, now observed all over the United States as National Hospital Day.

Legion and Knights of Columbus was carried out before a crowd of 1500 veterans and their friends. The aim of National Hospital Day was to acquaint the general public with the type of work done by the modern hospital, and the far-reaching scope of its activities. In most of the city hospitals, all departments were thrown open to the public, and a special corps of nurses acted as guides to visitors all day.

Members of the American Legion traveled in a body from the legion home in Royal street to the hospital. Edmund R. Mabry, post commander, and Dr. Eugene Davis, commanding officer of the hospital, made short addresses, and Father Hayes of the Holy Name of Mary church offered the invocation.

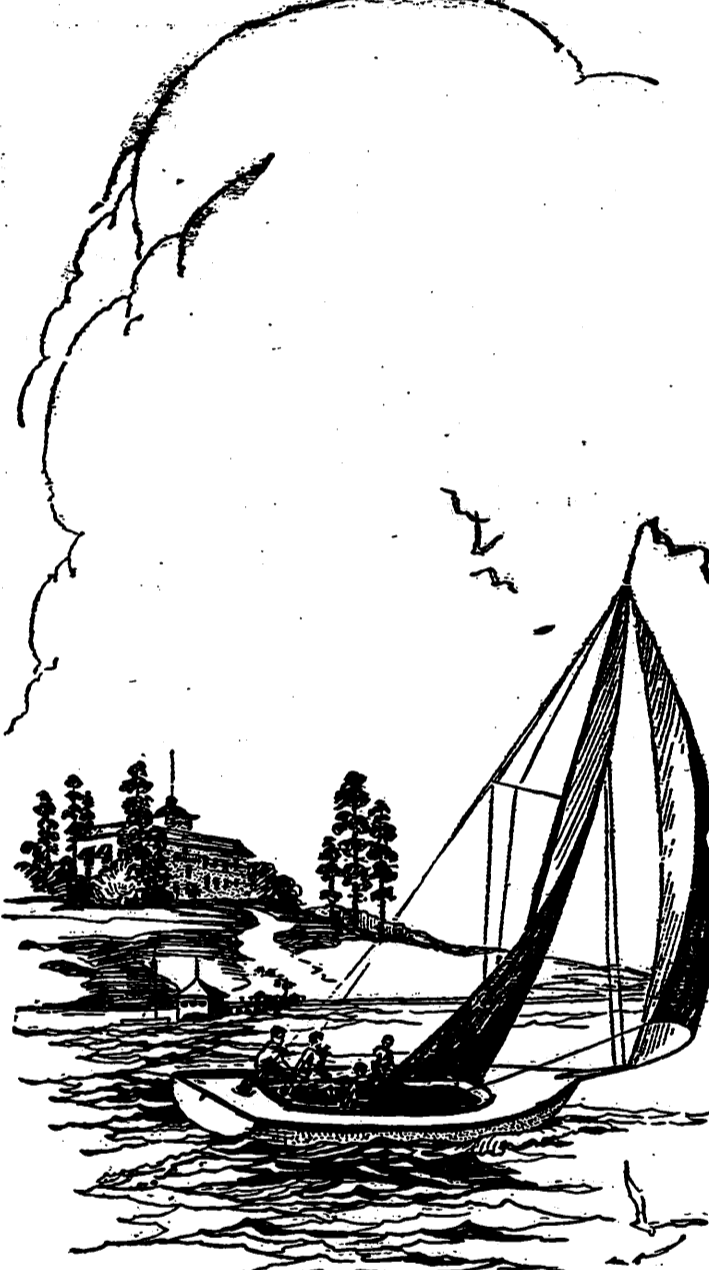

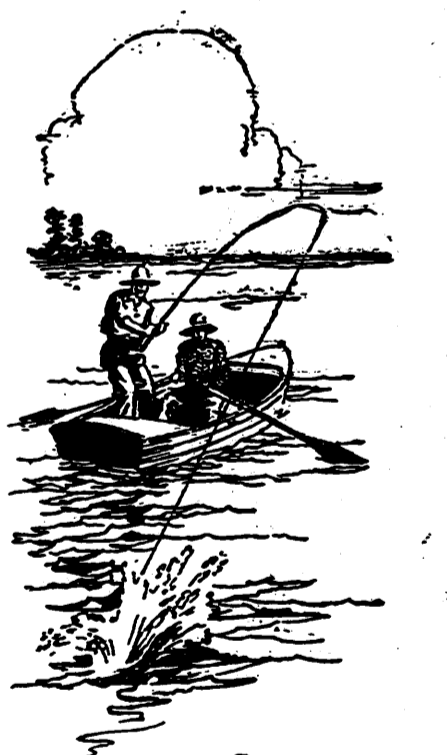

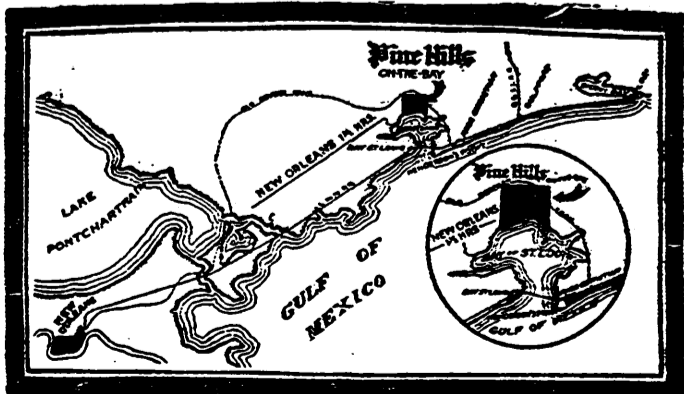
